ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

FIRST-TIME COLLEGE STUDENTS

All first-time college students must complete the required core curriculum in high school in order to meet the university's admission requirements:

17 UNITS OF HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT (1 UNIT = 1 YEAR IN CLASS)*

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Mathematics (Algebra 1 or higher)
- 3 units of Science (must include a lab science; cannot include general science)
- 3 units of Social Science
- 1 unit of Fine Arts
- 2 units of a single Foreign Language

* Individual programs may choose to impose additional requirements for admission.

First-time college applicants for the fall 2021 term have the option of being reviewed with or without test scores due to the impacts of COVID-19. Choosing an application review without test scores will mean your admissibility will be determined by a committee. To be considered for admission without standardized test scores you must have a 3.0 core GPA. The committee will require a personal statement and official high school transcripts. A student may also submit a resume and letters of recommendation from high school teachers, administrators and/or guidance counselors, however these are not required for consideration. Learn more at umsl.edu/go/test_optional.

Regular admission requires a minimum combination of class rank percentile and standardized test scores (ACT or SAT). Students applying from high schools that do not rank will be evaluated on a combination of high school grade point average and standardized test scores.

Students with an ACT composite of 24 or higher, SAT total [CR+M] of 1090 or higher or redesigned SAT of 1160 or higher meet the requirements for admission. Students with an ACT composite score of 17-23, an SAT total [CR+M] score of 820-1080, or a redesigned SAT of 900-1150 need the following class rank percentile or GPA:

Students with an ACT composite score less than 17, a SAT total [CR+M] less than 820, or a redesigned SAT below 900 do not meet the minimum requirements for admission. Students who do not meet the minimum requirements may submit a letter of appeal to the Admission Appeals Committee for further consideration.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students transferring with 24 credit hours or more of post-high school, college-level coursework must have a minimum 2.3 grade point average across all courses at previous institutions to qualify for admission. Students transferring with fewer than 24 credit hours need to meet the requirements for first-time college students.

FAFSA 101

All UMSL undergraduate students are encouraged to submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA is available on October 1 preceding the start of the academic year. Be sure to file your FAFSA as early as possible for priority consideration for all scholarships and grants.

FAFSA Priority Date: February 1

Once the Office of Financial Aid receives your FAFSA, they will communicate with you via your UMSL email account. Be sure to activate it as soon as possible.

FINANCIAL AID 101

SCHOLARSHIPS are awarded by various organizations, universities or departments, don't have to be repaid and are usually based on merit, need or characteristics (place of residence, major, etc.). Application procedures vary.

GRANTS are awarded by federal or state governments, schools and private institutions, don't have to be repaid and usually require you to submit a FAFSA.

LOANS are borrowed from the federal government or private lenders, have set limits and must be repaid with interest. Each type comes with certain eligibility requirements and most require you to submit a FAFSA.

STUDENT STATUS refers to a student's course load per semester.

Full time = 12 credit hours per semester

Part time = 6 credit hours per semester

EFC stands for Expected Family Contribution and is determined through completion of the FAFSA.

LOOKING FOR MORE?

THE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARS PROGRAM offers academically gifted first-generation or underrepresented St. Louis-area high school students an all-inclusive, four-year scholarship that includes individualized mentoring and career development. Learn more at honors.umsl.edu.

THE EXPRESS SCRIPTS BRIDGE PROGRAM SCHOLARSHIP offers \$15,000 a year toward tuition and student-housing, a laptop and book stipend, plus networking, internships and professional mentoring opportunities at the neighboring Express Scripts headquarters. Learn more at bridge.umsl.edu.

THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRESIDENT'S SCHOLARSHIP offers full tuition and fees for up to 15 credit hours per semester to students who have completed an associate degree from Jefferson College, Mineral Area College, Southwestern Illinois College, St. Charles Community College or St. Louis Community College. Contact your community college financial aid office for more information.



ACCESS MISSOURI AWARD: This is a renewable, need-based grant program for undergraduate students who are Missouri residents and US citizens or permanent residents. Students must be enrolled full time and awards are based on the student's EFC as determined by the FAFSA. Award amounts vary annually.

BRIGHT FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIP: This is a merit scholarship for students who score in the top 3% of all Missouri high school students taking the ACT or SAT exams in their senior year. Renewable scholarships of up to \$3,000 are available for students who are enrolled full time in the academic year following graduation from high school.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT INCENTIVE GRANT: Students eligible for the Access Missouri Award may also be eligible for this non-renewable grant. Awards of up to \$500 are provided to students who achieve two grades of three or higher on Advanced Placement exams in the fields of math or science.

THE FAST TRACK WORKFORCE INCENTIVE GRANT: This is a program for Missouri residents who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are 25 years or older, have not been enrolled in any school within the last two years and are working toward their first bachelor's degree. This program is designed to ensure, when combined with other governmental financial aid, that tuition and fee costs are fully covered.

FEDERAL LOANS AND GRANTS

FEDERAL STAFFORD LOANS: The U.S. Department of Education provides both subsidized and unsubsidized loans for students attending college at least half time. Students with demonstrated need may receive subsidized loans. Unsubsidized loans are not based on need.

FEDERAL PELL GRANT: The Pell Grant program provides awards to undergraduate students with demonstrated need who are seeking and have not already earned a bachelor's degree. The grant amount is based on your EFC, your enrollment status, and your attendance for the academic year.

FEDERAL PLUS LOANS: Parents, adoptive parents, and stepparents of dependent undergraduate students attending college at least half time in a degree-seeking program are eligible for PLUS loans. Approval is subject to credit criteria established by the U.S. Department of Education.

FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT: This grant is for undergraduate students who demonstrate exceptional need. Funding is limited and awards are made as funds are available with priority given to those with the lowest EFC. Awards range from \$100 to \$4,000 a year.

IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN SERVICE GRANT: A student who is not eligible for a Pell Grant but whose parent or guardian was a member of the U.S. Armed Forces and died as a result of service performed in Iraq or Afghanistan after September 11, 2001 may be eligible for this grant. The student must be under 24 years old and be enrolled at least half time at the time of the parent's or guardian's death.

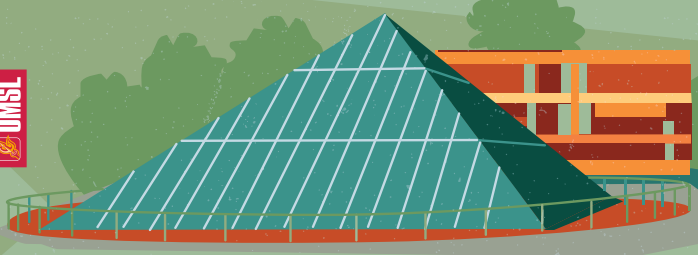
